The Advent Wreath. One of the most recognizable customs for the season is the Advent wreath. The unbroken circle of greens is an image of everlasting life. Its circular shape, without beginning or end, symbolizes God's unending love for us. The wreath itself is made of various evergreens, signifying continuous life, even during the dormant time of winter. The four candles mark the progress of the four weeks of Advent and the growth of light, despite the wintry darkness that surrounds us.

Call to Worship and Lighting of the Advent Wreath

The Advent season begins in darkness as we await the coming of Christ. In the midst of darkness we are reminded of a single light that provides peace and hope.
