Sermon

The Rev. Dr. Elizabeth Eaton Presiding Bishop of the ELCA

Bishop Elizabeth Eaton was elected as the first woman to become the fourth Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on August 14, 2013, and was reelected during Church Wide Assembly in 2019. Prior to her election, Eaton served as bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod. She was ordained in 1981 after a call to serve All Saints Lutheran Church in Worthington, Ohio and a one-year term as interim pastor at Good Hope Lutheran Church in Youngstown, Ohio. She was serving as pastor at Messiah Lutheran Church in Ashtabula, Ohio when she was called to become bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod.

Bishop Eaton was present and assisted in worship at St. John's on September 17, 2011 when we hosted a joint Covenant service of worship and celebration with the African Methodist

Episcopal Zion Church which also included then Presiding Bishop Mark Hanson of the ELCA, Bishop Bolick of the NC Synod of the ELCA and Senior Bishop George Walker of the AME Zion Church.

Bishop Eaton's four emphases for the ELCA are: We are church; We are Lutheran; We are church together; We are church for the sake of the world. These four emphases are fundamental to identifying who we are as the church of Christ. As presiding bishop, Eaton travels extensively, representing the ELCA in a variety of capacities. She and her husband, The Rev. T. Conrad Selnick, are parents of two adult children, Rebeckah and Susannah.


