The Holy Spirit gathers us as the people of God

Confirmation Sunday. This morning, four youth will make public profession of their faith and lay claim to their baptismal promises. In baptism, we are welcomed into the covenant God first established with Abraham, the age-old reminder that God has taken the first step in our relationship with Him. In Confirmation — also known as Affirmation of Baptism — we say "yes" to that covenant relationship and agree to bear the image of Christ to all the world.

At St. John's and throughout most of the ELCA, Confirmation Sunday is the culmination of a two -year process of faith formation, which includes classwork, servant projects, retreats, and a week-long confirmation camp. These four students represent a handful of those whose confirmation journeys were cut short because of Covid-19. We rejoice with these students, while holding in prayer our other confirmands who continue this journey of faith.

A Litany for Reformation and ringing of the St. John's bell. As the litany begins, we make the sign of the cross as a reminder of our baptism.

We gather in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Word

We hear God's word in scripture reading, preaching, and song

First Reading: Romans 3:19-28

¹⁹St. Paul writes: Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

³⁴Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. ³⁵The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever.³⁶So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed. "

Affirmation of Baptism and Sacrament of Holy Baptism

Dave Roof presents the following confirmation students.

I present Lucy Burks and Millie Wymbs, who desire to make public affirmation of their Baptism, and Kari Downs and Makenna Martin, who desire to receive the sacrament of Holy Baptism.

Let us pray. Merciful God, we thank you for these sisters in Christ, whom you make your own by water and the Word in baptism. You have called them to yourself, enlightened them with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished them in the community of faith. Uphold them in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Addressing the students:

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? *I renounce them*.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? *I renounce them*.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? *I renounce them*.

Then let us all speak confess our faith using the words of the Apostles Creed:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

RITE OF CONFIRMATION

You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Each person responds: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

The minister addresses the entire congregation.

People of God, do you promise to support *these sisters* and pray for *them* in their life in Christ? **We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.**

Those making affirmation may kneel. The presiding minister prays for God's blessing. Stir up in (Lucy, Millie) the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. Amen.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM

Kari and Makenna, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to be baptized? *I do*.

As you are baptized today you, likewise, are entrusted with these responsibilities:

To live among God's faithful people, The hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, To proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, To serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

And to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

Do you promise to live into these responsibilities? (Kari and Makenna respond individually) I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

To the Congregation: People of God, do you promise to support Kari and Makenna and pray for them in their new life in Christ? **We do.**

Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

As water is poured three times over her head: Kari Brandon Downs, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Applying the oil. You have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

As water is poured over her head: Makenna DongNuo Martin, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Applying the oil. You have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

Kari and Makenna kneel individually.

Let us pray. Stir up in (Kari, Makenna) the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. **Amen.**

A candle (the light of Christ) is presented to Kari and Makenna: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

The confirmands and newly baptized stand and face the congregation:.

Let us rejoice with these sisters in Christ. We rejoice with you in the life of baptism. Together we will give thanks and praise to God And proclaim the good news to all the world.



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The Luther Rose

The symbolism of the Luther rose goes back to the 1520s. Luther explained that the red heart with the black cross at the center should remind us that the righteous live by faith in Christ the Crucified. The heart rests on a white rose to show that faith gives joy, comfort and peace. The rose is white, not red, because white is the color of heavenly spirits and angels. The white rose stands in a field of blue, the color of heaven, to show that joy in the spirit and in faith in this life is only the beginning of future heavenly joy. Surrounding the sky-blue field is a gold ring to show that happiness and joy in heaven has no end but lasts forever, just as gold is the highest, most noble and precious metal.


