n these few days before Christmas, the world is reminded of a simple yet profound story: of a baby born in the backstreets of Bethlehem. A baby who would change the world forever. But why Christmas? As humans continued to fall away, the prophecy of Isaiah sets the stage for God's dramatic intervention — becoming one of us, born of Mary. May the beautiful music and these time-honored readings be a blessing to you this morning as we prepare our hearts and minds for the Christmas celebration.



The Advent Wreath.

One of the most recognizable customs for the season is the Advent wreath. The unbroken circle of greens is an image of everlasting life. Its circular shape, without beginning or end, symbolizes God's unending love for us. The wreath itself is made of various evergreens, signifying continuous life, even during the dormant time of winter. The four candles mark the progress of the four weeks of Advent and the growth of light, despite the wintry darkness that surrounds us.



Presentation and Prayer

Candidates for baptism, parent(s), Godparent(s) and baptismal partner(s) gather with the minister at the font. The presiding minister addresses the parents and the congregation.

The Congregation's Response:

People of God, do you promise to support Ruby and pray for her in her new life in Christ? We do.

The Profession of Faith

People of God, do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; He descended to the dead.

On the third day He rose again; He ascended into heaven, He is seated at the right hand of the Father, and He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Thanksgiving at the Font

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

We give you thanks, O God...unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

Rite of Baptism The Rite of Baptism includes three symbols used in baptismal liturgy since the beginning of the church: water (for cleansing), oil (for sealing), and light (for proclaiming).

Baptism with Water. Ruby is baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Imposition of Oil. Oil is used to make the sign of the cross on Ruby's forehead, a symbol that she is sealed in relationship with Christ.

Gift of Light. Ruby is welcomed into the Family of God. A candle (the light of Christ) is presented to her with the words, "Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: Join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative redeeming Word to all the world.

As Ruby is introduced to the congregation; all are invited to sing "Jesus Loves Me."

Jesus loves me! This I know, for the Bible tells me so; little ones to him belong, they are weak, but he is strong.

Refrain: Yes, Jesus loves me, yes, Jesus loves me, yes, Jesus loves me, the Bible tells me so.

CHRISMON DISTRIBUTION

Every year at Christmas, all children and youth of St. John's are presented with a "Chrismon" (Christ monogramed) ornament. The Chrismon this year is a key, symbolizing the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven.
