For those with special needs, please note that grape juice is available and the bread is already gluten free. Those with walking difficulties may receive the bread and wine by notifying an usher. A pastor will then bring you communion after distribution.

Children are invited to gather with Ms. Stacey in the Narthex at **3:50 pm.** We will process in together after the Kingdom Kids Choir performs to have an interactive telling of the Christmas story. If your child would like to come up to hear the story as we process in they are welcome to join.

CHRISTMAS PROCLAMATION*

The coming of Christ at Christmas, then, is seen as the summit of both sacred and secular history.
