Members of each congregation, pastors, lay people, and youth have travelled across the many miles from Salisbury, NC to Palestine and back again. We have prayed for each other over simulcasts and in written devotions. We have stayed in contact over many miles and many time changes.

This May, Christmas Lutheran begins a new chapter in their life and ministry. Rev. Munther Isaac, the pastor of Christmas Lutheran, is moving to a new congregation in his synod, The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Jordan and the Holy Land, and with his move a new pastor, Rev. For this momentous occasion in the life of the congregation and to form new and lasting bonds with Pastor Ashraf, St. John's is sending a small delegation to attend Pastor Munther's last Sunday. Pastor Dan, Pastor James, and Michael Connor will be traveling to Bethlehem from May 19–27. During their time they will meet with members of the Bethlehem community, Dar Al-Kalima University, and with other groups associated with our Covenant Partnership. Please pray for safe travels and a fruitful visit for all involved. We are especially thankful for Pastor Munther's leadership and ministry and look forward to working with Pastor Ashraf.

President-Elect Election

The Council held an election for our 2025 President-Elect and I am most pleased to announce that Board Secretary Brad Trick was elected on the third ballot. As President-Elect, he will serve as Council President in 2026 and will spend the remainder of this year preparing to hit the ground running. Brad also agreed to continue 2025 as our Secretary. Congratulations to Brad!

Property News

Dennis Rogers reported the good news that the CDC roof issues will be covered by insurance. David Whitley of David's Roofing completed the work on Good Friday and Saturday (i.e., when the CDC was closed). Rogers also reported that the Property Committee is still seeking a third quote on the elevator; it is hard to find people who do the kind of work needed. Mark Lewis observed that the elevator had been out of order for 10 hours two Sundays ago, highlighting the urgency of the issue. Pastor Dan noted that Steven Elliott started a few weeks ago as Brandt Cozad resigned and has done a great job so far, making for a very smooth transition.

Update on search for new Worship Minister

Pastor Dan reported that the Call Committee met to review the first set of applications. They narrowed down 20 applicants to 5, with 3 alternates. They will start letting candidates know whether or not they have been selected for next steps soon.

Tabled Bylaw Proposal

Lewis noted that at the recent congregational meeting to approve the changes to the Constitution, *the proposed* bylaw C12.02.03, which restricts family members of current staff and Council members from serving on Congregation Council sought to codify our current practice. Lewis's recommendation, which the Council endorsed, was to send the proposal to Personnel to review since they never had a chance to weigh in on the matter. He noted that there was plenty of time since the issue would not be addressed again until either the Annual Meeting or when we next update our Constitution.

Approve Outreach Endowment Requests

Lewis explained the purpose of the endowment funds (i.e., outreach) and reminded the Council that, of this year's available \$71,310, with \$5,000 reserved for matching grants. That left \$66,310 to be divided between two 2025 funding cycles. While the Executive Committee typically tries to leave about half of the funds for the Fall session, we had requests for almost \$104,000 this Spring. The Executive Committee accordingly decided to recommend that we grant more than half of the funds this Spring, but it decided to reserve at least \$20,000 for the Fall. In the end, the Council voted to dispense \$41,150 now, leaving \$25,160 for the fall cycle.

Church Leadership TEAM Meeting

On April 1, we held the second quarterly TEAM meeting. The purpose of this meeting is to continue improving our internal communications by sharing our progress on church and individual Ministry Group/Committee goals. Each committee is given a couple of minutes to share and to give one ministry group/committee extended time. This quarter we heard from Karen Puckett, chair of the Mercy and Justice Ministry Group. She shared the extensive outreach efforts taking place under this banner. This was a great chance for those on the Council to hear directly from our leaders and identify areas of those needing support. Plus, it was an opportunity to engage in questions and discussions as we seek to rebuild the infrastructure and rhythm of our work. Feedback was positive from the attendees. Our next quarterly meeting will be the first Tuesday in July.

David Harris, the director of the Raleigh Ringers, was the clinician. They were able to work on and perfect 6-7 pieces that covered different seasons of the church year. They will present one of these pieces on Good Friday, and another on Easter. After Easter, they will continue working on pieces for the Men's Chorus Concert and worship services before taking a break for the summer. The Luther Ringers is a group of experienced ringers who enjoy praising God through playing advanced handbell music.

WOMEN'S ENSEMBLE

Since Rob Durocher's retirement, the SJLC Women's Ensemble now has a new director, Mark Tysinger. Mark previously served as the Women's Ensemble accompanist and is a frequent guest pianist at St. John's. He was the Assistant Conductor and Chorus Master for Opera Carolina for over two decades and also served as the Principal Keyboardist for the Charlotte Symphony for 30 years. Mark holds a Masters of Music degree in vocal coaching/accompanying from the University of Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music.

The SJLC Women's Ensemble is now accepting new members to join us. We rehearse on Sundays at 5:15pm in the choir room and regularly sing in worship.
