#### **PROFESSION OF FAITH**

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God, the powers of this world that rebel against God, and the ways of sin that draw you from God? If so, say, *I renounce them*.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

We rejoice with you in the life of baptism. Together we give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world.

We walk by faith and not by sight, no gracious we hear from him who spoke as none e'er spoke, but we believe him near.


We may not touch his hands and side, nor follow where he trod; but in his presence we rejoice and cry, "my Lord and God!"



Jesus welcomes sinners and eats with them. Come to this meal of mercy. **Thanks be to God.** 




