People of God, do you believe in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.


Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

Rite of Baptism. The **Rite of Baptism** includes three symbols used in baptismal liturgy since the beginning of the church: water, oil, and light.

Baptism with Water. Juno and Layton are baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Imposition of Oil. Oil is used to make the sign of the cross on the foreheads of Juno and Layton, a symbol that they are sealed in relationship with Christ.

Gift of Light. Juno and Layton are welcomed into the Family of God. A candle (the light of Christ) is presented to them with the words, "Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

The Congregation Welcomes Juno and Layton into the Family of God

We welcome you into the Lord's family. We receive you as fellow members of the body of Christ, children of the same heavenly Father, and workers with us in the kingdom of God. The congregation is invited to sing "Jesus Loves Me."

Jesus loves me! This I know, for the Bible tells me so; little ones to him belong, they are weak, but he is strong.

Refrain: Yes, Jesus loves me, yes, Jesus loves me, yes, Jesus loves me, the Bible tells me so.

¹Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the LORD under Eli. The word of the LORD was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.


