
On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Rite of Baptism. The **Rite of Baptism** includes three symbols used in baptismal liturgy since the beginning of the church: water, oil, and light.

Baptism with Water. Kolbe is baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Imposition of Oil. Oil is used to make the sign of the cross on Kolbe's forehead, a symbol that he is sealed in relationship with Christ.

Gift of Light. Kolbe is welcomed into the Family of God. A candle (the light of Christ) is presented to him with the words, "Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

My hour has not yet come." ⁵His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

⁶Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. ⁷Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. ⁸He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. ⁹When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom ¹⁰and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." ¹¹Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

"Lift Every Voice and Sing" was written in 1900 by James Weldon Johnson, the principal of a segregated school in Jacksonville, FL. The poem was to commemorate the birthday of Abraham Lincoln and to honor the school's featured guest, Booker T. Washington. Johnson's brother set the poem to music in 1905. It has since been known as the Black National Anthem, voicing a powerful cry for liberation for all who live in oppression.
